

Beaufort Wind Scale

Beaufort Number	Miles Per Hour	Terms Used By U.S.W.B.	Description
0	Less Than 1	Light	Calm. Smoke rises vertically.
1	1 - 3	Light	Direction of wind shown by smoke drift.
2	4 - 7	Light	Wind felt on face. Leaves rustle.
3	8 - 12	Gentle	Leaves and small twigs in constant motion.
4	13 - 18	Moderate	Raises dust and loose paper. Small branches are moved.
5	19 - 24	Fresh	Small trees in leaf begin to sway.

6	25 - 31	Strong	Large branches in motion. Whistling heard in telegraph wires.
7	32 - 38	Strong	Whole trees in motion. Walking against wind is difficult.
8	39 - 46	Gale	Breaks twigs off trees.
9	47 - 54	Gale	May break tree branches; damage structures.
10	55 - 63	Storm	Trees uprooted. Considerable structure damage.
11	64 - 72	Storm	Widespread damage.
12	73 or more	Hurricane	Rarely experienced. Widespread damage.

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
